Let's exchange what we know

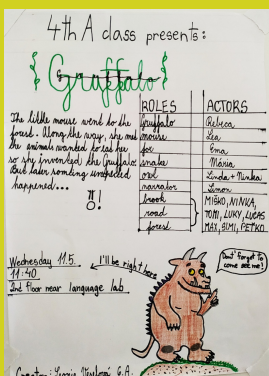
